Prisoners' Justice Day began in commemoration of **Eddie Nalon**, who bled to death in the segregation unit of Millhaven Maximum Security Prison, located just west of Kingston, on August 10, 1974. The date has become an annual event in remembrance of all those who have died in prison.

This year, CFRC recognizes the 35th annual Prisoners' Justice Day with a special live broadcast. Tune in at **101.9FM** or listen on-line at www.cfr.ca on the evening of **Tuesday, August 10th, 5PM to midnight**, to hear interviews, analysis and music about prisons and prisoners.
